This will be Florida's 39th statewide book event -- *spirits are high!* Organizers are predicting a record attendance, and the Fair's many exhibitors are eager to welcome browsers and buyers. Offerings include rare books, pamphlets, and maps, as well as affordable ephemera and collectibles. The star of the show just may be a rare edition, with presentation box, of the Salvador Dali *Illustrated Alice In Wonderland* – visit the A. Parker's Books booth (see Gallery, below).


